In her west London house, **Kim Hersov**, co-founder of the boho lifestyle label Talitha, has created an eclectic family home filled with flea-market finds

or Kim Hersov, her home reflects her nomadic sensibilities: it's a kaleidoscope of rich, saturated colours and collectibles found by trawling the world's best flea markets with her great friend, the interior designer Hubert Zandberg.

Alongside old seashells, bamboo chairs and gilded screens, she has combined the irreverence of her artist husband, Barry Reigate, with antique pieces and a sense of old Hollywood glamour inspired by her own Californian childhood.
