## [7] TROMPE-L'OEIL

Inspired by the trompe-l'oeil tented room at the 15th-century Casa degli Atellani in Milan, the US interior designer Miles Redd created the illusion of fabric on this ceiling using paint. This draws the eye up to the high arches in the space. reddkaihoi.com
